ASSOCIATE OF ART

The Administration of Justice program prepares students for a career in criminal justice. By completing the program requirements, students gain the ability to apply principles of the justice system, constitutional and procedural considerations affecting arrest, search and seizure, human relations, and concepts of criminal law as well as demonstrate proficiency in report writing and record keeping. Career options include police officers, corrections officers, homeland security, private security, and crime scene investigators.

Program Student Learning Outcomes

- Students employ the basic process of a preliminary investigation.
- Students distinguish between local, state, and federal jurisdictional authority.
- Students identify major case law decisions impacting law enforcement.
- · Students identify the basic elements of the criminal trial process.
- Students recognize how cultural diversity impacts police-community relations.
- Students recognize the parameters regarding search and seizure and use of force.
